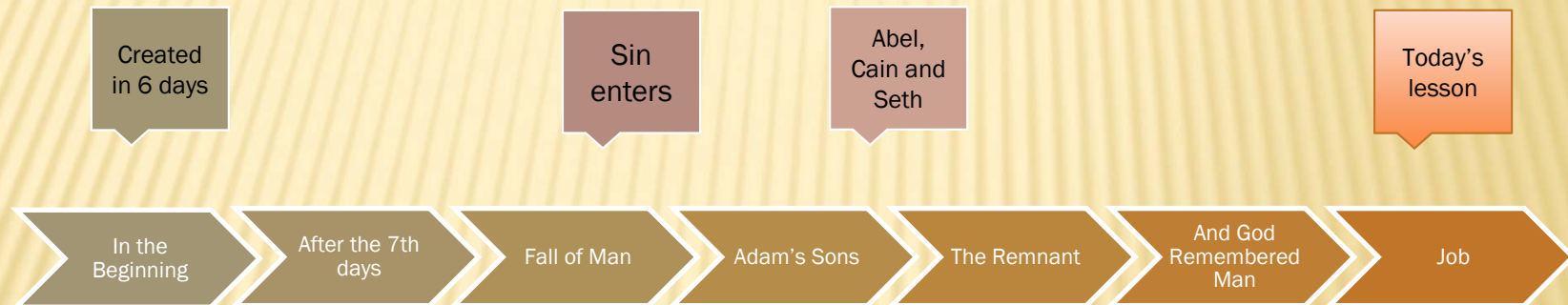

JOB'S PERSPECTIVE

Job's Perspective

- 7 sons & 3 daughters; 7000 sheep; 3000 camels; 500 yoke of oxen; 500 female donkeys; and a very large household (servants) (Job 1: 2,3)
- Job was "...greatest of all the people in the East" (Job 1:3)
- Sabeans stole 500 yoke of oxen, 500 female donkeys and killed some of his servants (Job 1:14,15)
- 7000 sheep and some of Job's servants were killed by the fire of God (Job 1:16)
- Chaldeans raided 3000 camels and the killed the servants (Job 1:17)
- Job's children die (Job 1:18,19)
- *Job's Response (Job 1: 20,21)*
- Job was struck with painful boils from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head (Job 2:7)
- Wife's response – (Job 2:9)
- His friends response – (Job 2:13)
- Job's response – (Job 1: 10)

GOD'S PERSPECTIVE

God's Perspective

- Job was blameless and upright. He feared God and shunned evil (Job 1:1)
- Interceded regularly on behalf of his children (Job 1: 5)
- God offers Job to be tested by Satan (Job 1:8-12)
- *Job's Response to loosing his wealth (Job 1:22)*
- Job's response to loosing his health
- "...In all this Job did not sin with his lips" (Job 2: 10)
- "...for they [Job's friends] saw that his grief was great" (Job 2:13)

JOB LAMENTS – JOB 3:1-26

- ✘ Job 1:20,21 – loss of possession
- ✘ Job 2: 10 – loss of a friend
- ✘ Job 2: 12,13 – loss of health
 - + Isaiah 53: 2 & 3
- ✘ Job 3 – Job deploras his birth
 - + Mark 15:33,34 – Unlike Job, Christ is forsaken
