Interaction with Lot

Abram	Lot
Offered the first choice • Phillipians 2:3	He took it and didn't offer it back
 He stood by his word and chose Canaan (Genesis 13:12) Lord reaches out to Abram (Genesis 13:14) Abram dwelled by the terebinth trees of Mamre & built an alter to the Lord (Genesis 13:18) 	 Watered everywhere like garden of Eden and Egypt Dwelt in the cities of the plain (Genesis 13:12) Pitched his tent even as afar as Sodom (Genesis 13:13)
	• Ambitious Christian (2 Peter 2:7,8)
	 He saw, chose, and lived there

Before interacting with Melchizedek

Context:

- Chedorlaomer, King of Elam (Persia) ruled the land adjacent to the Dead Sea for 13 years
- 5 captive kings rebelled against Chedorlaomer
- Chedorlaomer with the help three kings from the region of Babylon fight the rebels
- The battle takes place in the Valley of Siddim which was full of asphalt pits
- Chedorlaomer wins the battle and march north with Lot and others
- Abram with 318 trained men defeat Chedorlaomer and <u>rescue Lot</u>

Interaction with Melchizedek


Abram	Melchizedek
 Abram accepts the bread and wine Abram accepts the blessing Abram tithe of all (1/10) his captured prizes (Hebrews 7:2) 	 He offered the bread and wine to Abram (Genesis 14:18) He blessed Abram (Genesis 14:19,20)
	 Melchizedek means "King of Righteousness" (Hebrews 7:2) Melchizedek was the King of Salem & Salem means "King of Peace" (Hebrews 7:3) No genealogy mentioned Order of Melchizedek which is forever (Psalms 110:4) Melchizedek was a mortal
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Bottom line: Abram met a royal priest and the priest initiated the interaction. Abram recognized Melchizedek and interacted with him. Melchizedek is a picture of Christ but Christ is far greater

Interaction with God

- Intimate discussion with God about God's promise to Abram
- Abram doubts God's promise (Genesis 15:2)
- God points him to the stars (Genesis 16:5)
 - Genesis 12:2
 - Genesis 13:16
 - Genesis 17:6
- God provides specific timelines for unconditional covenant

Application

- Abram's struggles and God's plan
 - Spiritual view Returning to Canaan
 - Worldly view Coming back with wealth
- Abram is compared to:
 - Man Pharaoh, King of Sodom
 - Worldly Christian Man Lot
 - Godly man (almost like Christ) Melchizedek
- Abram's biggest asset (Isaac) and Abram's submission to God.
