
Introduction

- Genesis: We talked about the downfall of Man
 o From the Garden of Eden to Death
 - Adam, Cain,
- Romans: We talked the downfall of Man (spiritual state)
 - o Romans 1:18-32
- Definition of Church
 - o Ephesian 5:25-27,29
- Revelations 1:4,11
 - o Addressed to seven churches (verse 4)
 - o Lists the seven churches (verse 11)
- Matthew 13: 3-8; 24-30; 33

The 7 churches

- They existed in Asia when John wrote Revelations
- They are related to the 7 parables in Matthew 13
- Bill MacDonald's stated that they are reflected of how "Church" did over time.



Philadelphia (Rev 3: 7-13)

- The ideal state for a church
- Philadelphia = Love for the brethren
- Praised for:
 - o In human strength, they trusted in the Lord and preserve the truth
 - o Keeping Christ's word
 - o Not Denying Christ's Name
 - o Perseverance
- Warned about:
 - o Needing to hold fast to what they had; and
 - o preserving through the coming of tribulation
- From a Historical Church View
 - o During the 18th & 19th centuries, there were mighty revivals and great missionary movements
- Biblical Perspective:
 - o Adam (pre-fall)
- Personal Walk
 - o Closest to the Lord

Smyrna (Rev 2:8-11)

- The persecuted church
- Smyrna = myrrh or bitterness
- Praised for:
 - o Tribulation
 - o Poverty
- Warned About
 - o Needing to be faithful under persecution
- From a Historical Church View
 - o From 1st to 4th century under the Roman emperors
- Biblical Perspective
 - o Stephen
 - o Joseph and others
- Personal Walk
 - o When we are being tempted, persecuted and tried

Pergamos (Rev 2: 12 -17)


- The Compromising Church
- Pergamos = The High Tower or Thoroughly Married
- Praised for:
 - o Holding fast to Christ's name
 - o Not Denying the faith, even when faced with martyrdom
- Warned About
 - o Allowing false teaching to spreading immorality and idolatry
 - o Holding to Nicolaitan doctrine
- From a Historical Church view
 - During the 4th and 5th century, Christianity was recognized as an official religion through Constantine's patronage
- Biblical Perspective
 - o King Solomon after he became king
- Personal Walk
 - o When we give into a temptation

Thyatira (Rev 2:18-29)

- The Corrupt Church
- Thyatira = The Perpetual Sacrifice or Continual Offering
- Praised for:
 - o Love, Service, Faith and Patience
- Warned About:
 - o Allowed Jezebel to Seduce others to immorality and idolatry
 - o Needing to hold fast and overcome
- From a Historical Church view
 - During the 6th and 15th century, the Roman Catholic Church largely held sway in Western Christendom until Rocked by the Reformation. In the East, the Orthodox Church ruled
- Biblical Perspective
 - o Kings of Israel before the nation was destroyed
- Personal Walk
 - o Know you are living a sinful life

Sardis (Rev 3:1-6)

- The dead church
- Sardis = Those Escaping or Renovation
- Praised for:
 - o A few faithful people
- Warned About:
 - o Deadness of faith despite their reputation for being alive
- From a Historical Church view
 - The 16th and 17th centuries were the Post-Reformation period,. The light of the Reformation soon became dim
- Biblical Perspective
 - o Cain, Judas
- Personal Walk
 - o Hardened to sin




Ephesus (Rev 2: 1-7)

- The loveless Church
- Ephesus = A later place
- Praised for:
 - Labor, Patience, Not putting up with evil people, testing false apostle, perseverance, hating the deeds of the Nicolaitians
- Warned About:
 - o Leaving their first love
- From a Historical Church view
 - The Christ of the first century generally praiseworth but it had already left its first love
- Biblical Perspective
 - o Pharisees
- Personal Walk
 - o Legalistic

Laodicea

- The Lukewarm Church
- Laodicea = The people ruling or the judgement of the people
- Praised for:
 - o Not Praised
- Warned About:
 - Being Lukewarm, pretending to be spirituality rich when they were spiritually impoverished
- From a Historical Church view
 - o The Church of the last days
- Biblical Perspective
 - o Pilate
- Personal Walk
 - o Apathetic



Application

- The parables in Matthew 13
 - o There will always be real Christians and pretenders in any church
 - o Be focused on God and His Word
 - Don't give into temptations and don't let sin fester
 - o Show love through God
 - Not because you have to.
